Without careful pre-planning, the schedule will not allow the completion of both the Child Development major and the elementary Multiple Subjects Teacher Credential in the 4.5-year time frame.

*The Program of Teacher Preparation requires 150 documented **early fieldwork** hours at **MSMU Ed. Dept.-identified** sites, before enrolling in supervised teaching. It is necessary to have significant blocks of time in a sufficient number of semesters for observation/participation and travel time in order to complete the hours.*

Hours for observation and participation must be:

- 1) the same each week (not flexible),*
- 2) at least, a two-hour block (four hours is a better block),*
- 3) scheduled in the morning and early afternoon.*

Block out these hours on your proposed semester schedule the same way you block out course days and times. If you are planning to complete the MSMU Concurrent Program of Teacher Preparation, you must schedule work (on- and off- campus), around your field experience hours.
